# German for Business and Economics, B2-C1

## Course Description

This course deals with current economic issues such as structural change, the future of work, demographic change, economics and ethics, social issues, intercultural communication and globalization.

The course content is systematically embedded in larger regional, cultural, historical and political contexts. The course materials such as press articles, videos, audio texts and diagrams are constantly updated and reflect a variety of viewpoints. The course is aimed at students of economics, business professionals and those interested in economics.

Oral and written competences are practiced in class: short presentations, debates, role plays, telephone calls, job interviews, writing emails and commercial correspondence, CVs and motivational letters. Action-oriented grammar exercises and vocabulary training complement the program.

# German for Natural Sciences and Engineering, B2-C1

## Course Description

This German language course is intended for participants from technical and science-oriented professions and degree courses.

In this course, technical terms, useful phrases and scientific grammatical structures will be practiced with the help of authentic reading and listening comprehension tasks. Through discussions, simulations and the compilation of subject-relevant texts, students will improve their writing skills as well as problems with listening comprehension and speaking or presenting.

Using film sequences, audio lectures and specialist articles, different areas of the natural sciences will be examined, particularly in terms of their vocabulary.

# Training for German Language Teachers, C1-C2

## Course Description

This course is designed specifically for instructors who are teaching German language abroad and aims to expand and update the participants' didactic and methodological skills. It teaches methods of practical lesson planning based on learning theory and neurodidactics.

Thematic focuses include: Needs analysis and consideration of learner interests, methods of getting to know each other in class, warm-up exercises, context building, learning strategies, didactics of text production, exercises for authentic use of the target language, possibilities for internal differentiation, classroom management, teacher language - body language, use of media in class, forms of feedback.

These topics are dealt with using practical exercise examples from various textbooks and current teaching materials. The course offers participants a variety of opportunities to take an individual stance on specific questions relating to German lessons and to discuss various methodological and didactic approaches. Participants also develop exercises and lesson sequences themselves and carry out lesson simulations.

This course will provide participants who are looking to enhance their future career opportunities or improve their service quality with the confidence and skills needed in a German-speaking hospitality setting.

You can develop conversational proficiency through role-playing scenarios, including guest interactions, menu explanations, and customer service, and learn terminology related to food, beverages, room service, and hospitality operations to enhance communication with German-speaking guests and colleagues. Group discussions and real-life simulations are part of the program to reinforce language skills in a supportive environment.
