Course description

Students follow both modules in the Summer School program

Module 1: Business in Europe

(42 contact hours, equivalent to 3 US credit hours/6 ECTS credits)

- Intercultural Management & Eco-literacy: Bridging the Cultural Gap
- Sustainable Marketing in Europe
- Logistics in Europe

Module 2: European Economy and Policies

(42 contact hours, equivalent to 3 US credit hours/6 ECTS credits)

- SMEs in Europe
- European Economic Integration

Both modules will have a focus on sustainability



Admission process

Students must be nominated by their International Relations Coordinator who will send their students nominations by **March 15th, 2025** to EM Strasbourg Business School's International Office.

Requirements


- Proficiency in English (minimum level of B2 in English according to the Common European Reference Framework of Languages)
- Undergraduate level (at least 1 year of university studies)
- Basic knowledge in Business and/or Economics

All classes, lectures, and visits will be held in English and no prior knowledge of French is required.

Acceptance

Qualified students will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Upon acceptance, students will receive instruction on the next steps to finalize their application. Acceptance letters will be sent to students upon completion of their dossier.

2,500€ for students from partner universities
3,000€ for students from non-partner universities

Cancellation policy

Up until and including May 2nd, 2025, student cancellations will be refunded minus a 300 euros administrative fee. After May 2nd, 2025, no refund will be possible.

EM Strasbourg Business School reserves the right to cancel the Summer School if it does not have the minimum number of students. If this occurs, the full program fee will be returned to students.

Accommodation

The International Relations Office can book accommodation for individual students if they choose. Students will be able to request their accommodation choice on the Summer School Platform. There are two residences available, both next to EM Strasbourg Business School.

Additional costs

Meals

- Breakfasts at the main campus: approximately 5€ x 20 days (100€)
- Other breakfasts at your own discretion: maximum 5€ x 8 days (40€)
- Lunches at the main campus: approximately 5€ x 20 days (100€)
- Other lunches at your own discretion: 6-10€ x 10 days (100€)
- Dinners at your own discretion: 5-20€ x 25 days (mid-range 350€)

Total (high scale) for meals: ≈ 640€

Public Transportation (for a monthly bus/tram pass)

19-25 years old: 28€ + 5€ card

26-64 years old: 56€ + 5€ card

Visa and other immigration formalities

All students should check the expiration date of their passport before they leave their home country. It should be valid for at least 6 months after scheduled departure from Strasbourg.

Students from the EU

Students who hold the nationality of an EEA State (EU Member States + Switzerland, Norway and Liechtenstein) do not need a visa for France and do not need to go through any immigration procedures while in France. Nevertheless, students need to bring a valid passport or an Identity Card.

Students from outside of the EU

Students coming from outside of the EEA area should find out themselves if they require a visa to come to France. If this is the case, students should contact the local French consulate. Students are responsible for their visa procedures. EM Strasbourg Business School will provide the acceptance letter including housing details required for visa procedures.

Insurance

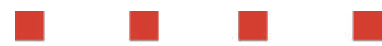
Students are required to have a health insurance during their stay in France.

European Students and Students from Quebec

If you come from one of the countries of the European Economic Area (EEA) AND if you pay for your national health insurance, your health protection in France will be ensured by your home country via the European Health Insurance Card which you need to arrange before coming to France. Students from Quebec benefit from an agreement between France and Quebec and have the same rights as the European students.

Non-European Students

Students coming from outside of the EEA need to have an international insurance that covers them in Europe.
